- <u>SPOT:</u> Spot is an online tool for the Bar to confidentially and anonymously report inappropriate behaviour and concerns.

- <u>Female Advocate's Breakfast (FAB)</u>: Three times a year, a breakfast is hosted to bring female advocates together in an informal setting, creating a focal point for access to advice and role models at a variety of levels of call and different areas of practice and to share experiences and provide support for each other. Fountain Court Chambers organises FAB and hosts a breakfast each summer. Other chambers volunteer to host two other breakfasts a year in January and October on a rotating basis. - <u>WCWF</u>: The WCWF runs social, networking and training events, and also commissions research projects. The WCWF does not require membership, but welcomes participation and ideas from all Circuiteers.

- <u>Black Barristers' Network:</u> The Black Barristers' Network runs a number of initiatives, programmes and events for practising and aspiring Black Barristers.
- <u>Behind the Gown</u>: Behind the Gown is committed to tackling abuse of power in the profession and shines a light on conduct which threatens equality.
- <u>Themis:</u> Themis aims to advance the rights of women at the employed and selfemployed Bar at every stage; tackle gender inequality and structural inequalities; inform members and the Bar more generally of issues facing women at the Bar, as well as to progress the rights of women and incentivise research.
